Opening...

- Describe a situation when you were super excited to tell somebody about something? (examples: pregnancy, engagement, new job, etc...) What motivated you to want to tell others?
- Pray for this time in God's Word— that we would hear from the text and from each other as the Holy Spirit guides us!

Background...

 Skim Matthew 28:1-15. What events take place in these verses? Note the different responses to these events.

Study...

- Read Matthew 28:16-20. How do the eleven disciples respond to Jesus in verses 16-17? Why such contrasting reactions?
- How do you see those different kinds of responses to Jesus in our world today? How about in your own heart and life?
- Now that Jesus has risen from the dead, what does he want the eleven disciples to do (verses 18-20) and why?
- Discuss the significance of the actions, order, and reach mentioned in Jesus's commission to the disciples?
- · How does Jesus reassure them?

Think about it...

- Do you think this commission is just for the eleven disciples or for all of Jesus's followers? Why or why not?
- If it is for his followers today, how have you (and how will you) participate in this great commission? When? How can your church community help you in it?
- Pray together— that God would reveal opportunities and motivation to fulfill this mandate through you and our church, remembering that he is with us always!
